
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


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THE MATRIX DIAGRAM

DEFINITION

The matrix

• Is a simple two dimensional grid which is used to determined the relative importance of the proximity of building spaces to one anthers in the facility.




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
THE BUBBLE DIAGRAM

DEFINITION

Bubble diagrams are systems of lines and circles used in architecture to show relationships between functional areas of a program to develop an architectural plan.





STEPS OF DRAWING A BUBBLE DIAGRAM

1. The spaces in a bubble diagram should be drawn as freehand bubbles, not as exact forms




2. The size of each bubble should represent the proportion of the spaces within that building not the exact size of it.




3. Small circles or bubbles each of which contains the name of one of the identified space.




4. The bubble representing the space under consideration is drawn first then other spaces relating to it are indicated in additional bubbles placed near the first bubble.



5. Heavy, medium and light weight lines can be used as a code to indicate strong, moderate and weak relationships.










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
FROM BUBBLE DIAGRAM TO ARCH. PLAN

INTRODUCTION


We should not try to convert the bubble diagram directly into a building plan with out exploring all the other design ideas that satisfy the adjacency requirements




The zoning lines surround and enclose all the spaces enrich belong to the same subclass an exclude the spaces that don't belong to the same subclass.




The zoning lines should not cross or touch each other (except at overlaps).








The zoning lines should be the heaviest lines in the diagram.




The number of spatial groupings in a zoning diagram may indicate the number of zones to be expressed in the building












EXAMPLES

EXAMPLES

In zoning principle, space divides itself into zones that group similar kinds of activities accordingly to the degree of privacy or sociable interaction.

Designer normally starts the design accordingly to three activities:

- 1. Social (living, dining and balcony)
- 2. Private (bedroom)
- 3. work (Kitchen) activities.
