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≻Why Is Repetition Needed?

Repetition allows you to efficiently use variables

- > Can input, add, and average multiple numbers using a limited number of variables
- > For example, to add five numbers:
 - Declare a variable for each number, input the numbers and add the variables together
 - Create a loop that reads a number into a variable and adds it to a variable that


contains the sum of the numbers

\succ There are four basic types of loops which are:

Loop Туре	Description				
For loop	Execute a sequence of statements multiple times and abbreviates the code that manages the loop variable.				
While loop	Repeats a statement or group of statements while a given condition is true. It tests the condition before executing the loop body				
Do-while loop	Like a while statement, except that it tests the condition at the end of the loop body				
nested loops	You can use one or more loop inside any another while, for or do- while loop.				

➢ For Loop

- \triangleright A for loop is a repetition control structure that allows you to efficiently write a loop that needs to execute a specific number of times.
- \succ The syntax of a for loop in C++ is: for (initial; condition; increment) statement(s);



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\succ The flow of control in a for loop

> The initial step is executed first, and only once. This step allows you to declare

and initialize any loop control variables. You are not required to put a statement

here, if a semicolon appears.

> Next, the condition is evaluated. If it is true, the body of the loop is executed. If it

is false, the body of the loop does not execute, and flow of control jumps to the

next statement just after the for loop.

\succ The flow of control in a for loop

- \succ After the body of the for loop executes, the flow of control jumps back up to
 - the increment statement. This statement allows you to update any loop control

variables. This statement can be left blank, as long as a semicolon

 \succ The condition is now evaluated again. If it is true, the loop executes and the

process repeats itself (body of loop, then increment step, and then again condition).

After the condition becomes false, the for loop terminates.

\succ The command goto

 \succ The goto statement is a control flow statement that causes the CPU to jump to

another spot in the code. This spot is identified through use of a statement label.

> The syntax of a goto statement in C++ is:

goto label;

label: statement;

➤ The Infinite Loop

> A loop becomes infinite loop if a condition never becomes false.

 \succ The for loop is used for this purpose.

> You can make an infinite loop by leaving the conditional expression empty.



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➤ While Loop

- The condition may be any expression
- \succ The loop iterates while the condition is true.
- When the condition becomes false, program control passes to the line immediately following the loop.



Consider the following C++ program segment:

cout << endl;</pre>



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Do While Loop

- Unlike for and while loops, which test the loop condition at the top of the loop, the do...while loop checks its condition at the bottom of the loop.
- A do...while loop is like a while loop, except that a do...while loop is guaranteed to execute at least one time.

► Nested Control Structures (Example 2)

- During your work in a factory, your boss asked you to work a program using the language C++ to establish a password consists of seven numbers for the treasury of the factory.
- Whereas in the case of entering incorrect password, a message will appear to the user (sorry, try again)
- Whereas in the case of entering correct password, a message will appear to the user (Treasury ready to open)
- ➤ Remark a password is (2385110)


